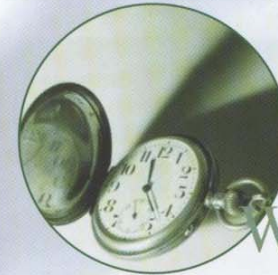
- > In partnership with workplaces in your community
