Program of study objectives: The practice of the trade consists in performing various tasks related to the maintenance of sports facilities and buildings using a refrigeration system (ammonia or halogenated fluid). These can be, in particular, public buildings (arenas), food stores, industrial buildings or institutional. The workers are called upon to operate a refrigeration system, to do first-level maintenance of sports facilities (ice, swimming pool), to support customer service, to carry out air quality management interventions and apply preventive and safety management methods.

Conditions of admission:

A person who meets the following conditions is eligible for admission to a program of study leading to an STC:

- 1 Has obtained at least Secondary III credits or the equivalent in the language of instruction, second language and mathematics;
- or Has obtained an Attestation of Equivalence of Secondary Studies (AESS);
- **or** Has successfully completed the General Development Test (GDT) with or without specific prerequisites.
- Has interrupted their full-time studies for at least 12 months;
- or Is 18 years old when entering training;
- or Has obtained a Secondary School Diploma (SSD) or a Diploma of Vocational Studies (DVS) or their equivalent;
- **or** Meets the eligibility conditions of Emploi-Québec's workforce training measure.
- This program is accessible via the <u>TCST-STC bridge</u>.
